SKI-TERS HAVE A SUPERB TRIP TO UTAH

Several Ski-ers joined the 70 participants in the Ogden Crescent Ski Council Trip in mid March to Powder Mountain (8 lifts & 5 peaks), Snowbasin (10 lifts & 5 peaks), and The Canyons (21 lifts including a high speed 6-Pack –with heated seats & 8 peaks). You could see some of the Men's and Women's Downhill runs from the 2002 Olympics. All I can say is they had no shortage of steep! For those with graying hair who like an easier route, there were plenty of long cruising blues and greens, able to make ones thighs talk to them. Without a doubt, there were more runs on those slopes than one could ski on the available week.

All had friendly Ski-Hosts who show you the short cuts and help avoid the need to stop and dig out one's glasses to chart the next part of your run. The weather was good with the exception of one morning with considerable snow at Snow Basin, but it cleared off in the afternoon. That is the trade off with spring skiing but the benefit is no one gets frostbite or cold feet.

Many of us took advantage of the planned Wednesday Day Off and shopped at 4 ski and outdoor stores in down town Ogden which had season end sales. Similarly, Ogden being both a college and industrial town had affordable restaurants and a wide variety of menu options at affordable prices—a nice treat on a ski trip.

Our mountain picnic turned out to be a white tablecloth top notch catered two meat buffet with made to order apple or peach cobbler alamode fit for a king. Similarly, the awards dinner at Union Station was well done with a 3- meat buffet. We had plenty of evening activities including Wednesday at the Solomon Center (all free with bumper cars, rock wall climbing, fan driven sky diving, and putt-putt golf). One Ski-er even won the prize for the golfer in most need of lessons!

Being Charleston was the start of American railroading (The Best Friend of Charleston); we had considerable rail history on this trip. Thursday before the farewell dinner we had the free run of the Ogden Railroad Museum which had everything from steam engines, largest diesel locomotives, jet engine powered engine which could pull 7 miles of cars (but melted an overpass when parked underneath), 100 and 250T locomotive cranes, WW-2 and 1 cars, to a rotary snow plow. Indoors were rooms of tools, paintings, and model train layouts showing the various parts of the state, all with guides to explain the history and the items. There was more stuff there than could be seen in a day.

Adjacent was the John M. Browning museum for the firearm designer of may Remington, Winchester, Colt, and Browning arms as well as his antique car collection. The guides were quite knowledgeable there also and willing to explain the good features as well as the maintenance nightmares. In summary, the least patronized trip ended up being the real gem of the ski season, and the Ogden Marriott provided an exceptional breakfast buffet every morning. You all missed a really great trip.

TAOS SKI TRIP

Twenty-three Ski-ers enjoyed the diverse culture of the great Southwest on the Crescent Ski Council trip to Taos NM in January. The group was fairly evenly divided between the two lodging options of the El Pueblo Lodge in Taos and the Snakedance Condos at the Taos Ski Resort.

Bus transfers were waiting our arrival at Albuquerque Airport to take us to a lunch stop at a micro- brewery in Santa Fe enroute to Taos. The El Pueblo Lodge had a welcome reception for those staying in town, the manager later said she knew we would be tired from traveling and thought we would all be hungry. The remainder of the stay in town was as pleasant. Those staying at Snakedance were equally treated with welcoming arms each being presented with a Snakedance fleece as well as a Tues. evening dinner and margarita party at the owners home. The Crescent Ski Council beat the previous margarita record established by the Florida Council.

Although we only had one day with snow, skiing was great. Nearly half of the group took advantage of the Ski Week for the 5-6 day two hour lessons. The instruction was terrific and we now know why Taos Ski School is rated so well. Mary Ann Myers said it was better than Steamboat Ski week. Mike and I attended the Ski Tech Talk one evening at the St. Bernard's Hotel. The instructor who gave the presentation had been at Taos for 30 of his 40 years of ski instructing and is the author of Visual Skiing.

Each day after morning lessons, we would join others for lunch and then group together for more adventures on the mountain. The evening activities that are always part of a Crescent Ski Week starting with the Welcome Party on Sunday evening at Tenderfoot Katie's where we were greeted by Travis with Taos Ski Resort to make sure we had the best week ever. At the Apres Ski party on Monday evening Debbie Ostrander was one of the winners of the Sumo wrestling event, and a great time was had by all cheering her on. Tuesday some ski-ers participated in the poker run, but some of the clues were a bit challenging, so they missed some of the stops along the way. Was it the "porcupine" for pork?

Wednesday many took the day off from skiing to tour the area. We visited the Millicent Rogers Museum and her fabulous collection of jewelry and pottery from the area. Another stop of the tour was the Martinez Haceninda that gave all a glimpse of what life was like in the early days and the blend of the Spanish life and influence in the area. After a lunch stop with the BEST chili rellanos in Taos (several took pictures which might end up in our cookbook) and a chance to explore the Old Plaza area---the final stop on the tour was Taos Pueblo, the location where the Taos Pueblo Indians have lived for 1000 years. The adobe structures are still inhabited today with out modern upgrades. Our tour started at the church explained the history and the blend of western and tribal culture.

Thursday evening was our farewell dinner and dance starting with social hour at the Martini Tree Bar with dinner at Tenderfoot Katie's. And again the Taos Resort out did itself with a fabulous buffet. On Friday, those in ski school got to learn the real history behind the Martini Tree bar when the classes were taken by for a taste from the flask at the REAL martini tree. Friday was the BBQ Picnic at the on mountain Phoenix Bar & Grill with transportation provided for the non-skiers to attend. There was something for everyone during the week, including a side trip to Santa Fe for Jean and Sue.

I want to thank all of those on the trip for making my task as trip leader so easy and for being a great group to ski with. Looking forward to many more runs with each of you in the future.

We participated in the Crescent Race Series from its beginnings and even won a challenge race against the Columbia Ski Club team as well as being invited to participate twice in the Southern Star Classic Races. We've had many who have won NASTAR Medals over the years.

We had lunch with Olympic Gold Medalist Jean Claude Killy when he introduced his line of ski clothing in Charleston in 1978.



In 1987 we adopted the name "Ski-ters". Over 800 ski-ters have joined thousands of Crescent members for over 40 conventions at Myrtle Beach and Hilton Head.

Approx. 600 have floated down the Edisto and Chatahoochee Rivers or gone white water rafting in NC, SC and West Virginia.

We have cruised the Charleston Harbor, the Bahamas, the Caribbean and to No Where. Cruising to No Where Tom Wylie lost the beer drinking contest to a female and Bob Mendenhall was our entry in the Bearded Beauties Nightgown Contest.

In Jackson Hole in 1981 Peggy Franklin won an award for skiing 100,000 vertical feet. She also earned the name of "Snow Mole" when she fell in a mogul field and slid under George Douglass' skies. And, George, known for his form in ski school was called the "Mad Bomber". He got down low, tackled any slope with a flying wedge and made his turns with a growl. Also, his ability to go from a mogul field to catwalk with a double binding release. Bobby Compton had the No. 1 Tush in Vail.

Just two weeks later 34 skiers departed from Charleston by bus headed for Sugar Mountain in the Boone, N. C., area. Pleasantly warm weather and good skiing made this first ski trip a tremendous success.

Since the trip the Board of Directors has elected (by a not-too-democratic system) a slate of temporary officers to serve the Club during its infancy.

The Greater Charleston Ski Club is a non-profit organization with a principal objective of furthering the sport of skiing in the area by providing its membership with the most skiing at the least price.
